Eligibility Criteria for Academic Programmes

M.Tech. and I2MP M.Tech Programmes Eligibility Criteria:

Bachelor's in engineering (total of 4 years) (OR)
Bachelor's with honors (3+1 years) in science (OR)
Master's in science/ relevant background (05 years)
<p>It is to be noted that bachelor's with a duration of 03 years are not eligible for the admission process.</p>

M.Sc Programmes Eligibility Criteria:

Chemistry	Bachelor's degree with Chemistry as a subject for 3 years/ 6 semesters and Mathematics at (10+2) level.
Mathematics	Bachelor's degree with Mathematics as a subject for at least 2 years or 4 semesters.
Physics	Bachelor's degree with Physics as a subject for at least 2 year / 4 semesters and Mathematics for at least 1 year/ 2 semesters.

M.A Programmes Eligibility Criteria:

Candidates must have completed a Bachelor's degree in Science, Arts, or Commerce, in the relevant or appropriate discipline, from a recognized university or institution.
Applicants must demonstrate good working knowledge of English.
A minimum CGPA of 7.0 on a 10.0 scale (or equivalent / First Class) is required.

Eligibility Criteria for Academic Programmes

M.S Programmes Eligibility Criteria:

Candidates must have completed their Bachelor's (total of 4 years) degree in the Relevant/Appropriate Discipline from a Recognized University or Institution

Applicants holding a Master's degree may apply to the M.S. programme, subject to departmental relevance, academic preparedness, and research alignment.

All applicants should have a Minimum CGPA of 7.0/10.0 (or its Equivalent/First class)

Ph.D. Programmes Eligibility Criteria:

Candidates must have completed both their Bachelor's (total of 4 years) degree and Master's degree in the Relevant/Appropriate Discipline from a Recognized University or Institution.

Subject to departmental relevance, academic preparedness, and research alignment.

All applicants should have a Minimum CGPA of 7.0/10.0 (or its Equivalent/First class)

Note for OCI Cardholders: If you hold an OCI (Overseas Citizen of India) card, you are treated as an international student for admission purposes only if you reside outside India. If you live in India, you generally follow the Indian national application process (GATE/JAM).
