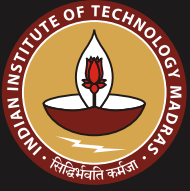

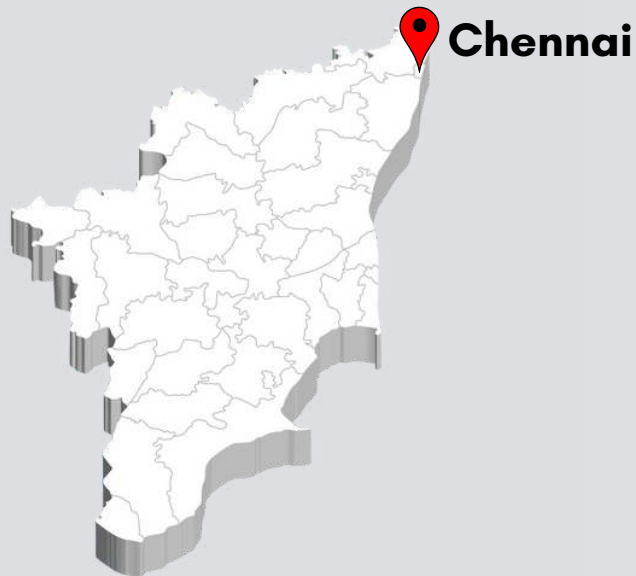

ABOUT IITM

The Indian Institute of Technology Madras (IITM) is a distinguished technical institution in Chennai, Tamil Nadu, India. Established in 1959 with support from the former government of West Germany, IITM is the third IIT established by the Government of India (GoI). With its commitment to excellence in education and research, IITM is a beacon of innovation and academic leadership in engineering and technology – both nationally and internationally. Over the years, IIT Madras has been recognised as one of the eight Institutes of Eminence in India. Since 2016, IITM has retained the top honours in Indian Higher Education as per the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF).

Right in the heart of this metropolis is the sylvan campus of the Indian Institute of Technology Madras (IITM). The campus spread over **632 acres (250 hectares)** of lush green forest, home to many endangered plants and animals, and a beautiful lake, is a welcome respite from the bustling city environment.

The Indian Institute of Technology Madras is among the premier institutes in the country for higher technological education, basic and applied research. In **1956**, the German government offered technical assistance for establishing an institute of higher education in engineering in India and the Institute was formally inaugurated in **1959**. It is an autonomous body under the administrative control of a Board of Governors appointed by the Government of India.

IIT Madras is a residential Institute with nearly **638** faculty members, **10,000+** students and **750** administrative & supporting staff and has a self-contained campus. It has established itself as a leading centre for teaching, research and industrial consultancy in the country.

The Institute has eighteen academic departments and a few advanced research centers in various disciplines of engineering and pure sciences, with nearly **100** laboratories organized in a unique pattern of functioning. A faculty of international repute, a brilliant student community, excellent technical & supporting staff and an effective administration have all contributed to the pre-eminent status of IIT Madras.



How to reach IITM?

After your arrival at the Anna International Airport, Chennai, you will make your way to the Institute by Prepaid Taxi or Call Taxi. The IIT campus is located on Sardar Patel Road, midway between the Raj Bhavan and Adyar and is about 12 kms from Chennai Airport. Other landmarks include the Guindy National Park near the IITM main gate and the Central Leather Research Institute (CLRI) campus opposite the IITM campus. At the 'IN' gate of the campus, there is a Security Check post, from where the road leads to Gajendra Circle (near the Administration Block and Central Library), via two alternate roads, Delhi Avenue and Bonn Avenue. The academic zone and the hostels are 3.8 km from the main gate of the Institute. If you have luggage, Prepaid Taxi or Call Taxi would be the most convenient option. The fare will be about INR 600.

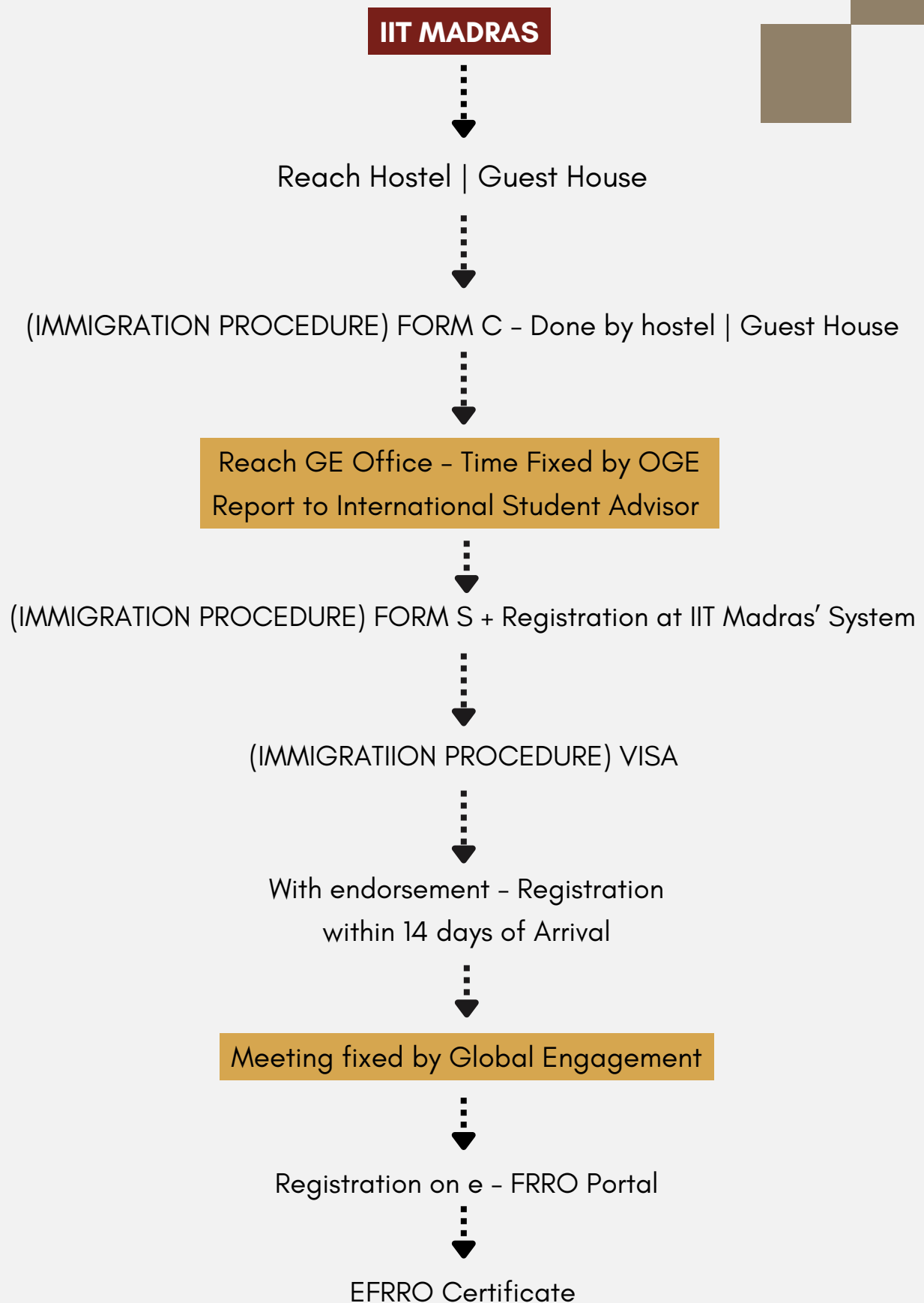
On-Campus Bus Transport:

Complaint Committee IITM

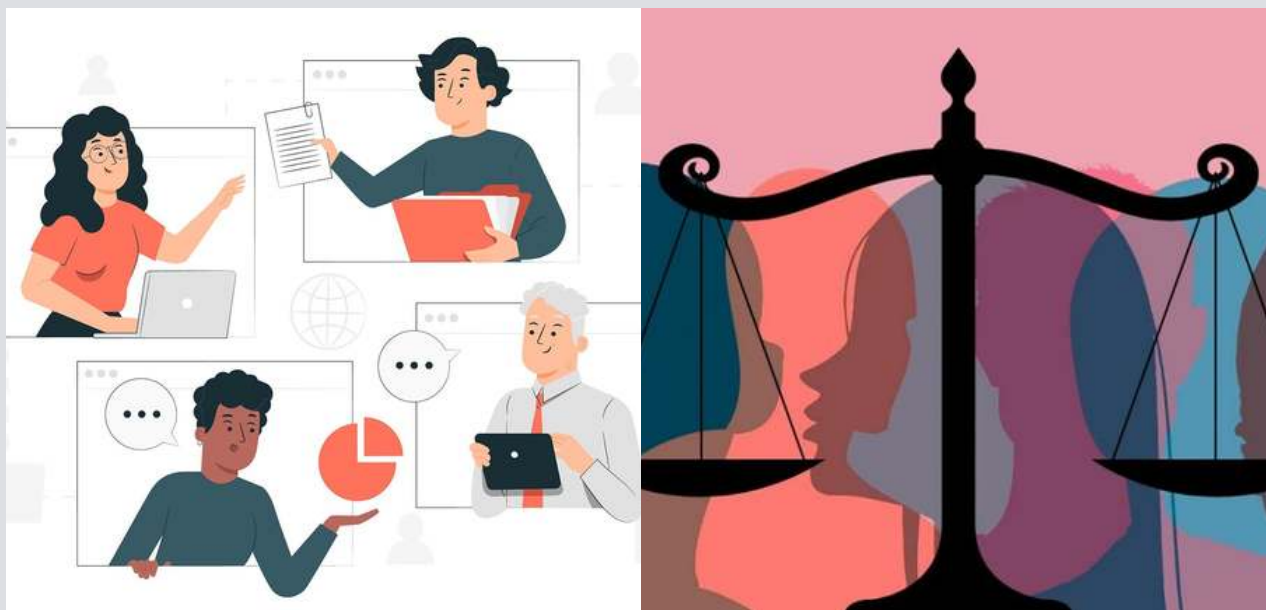

CCW - Hostels

IIT Madras is a residential institute and provides accommodation to students in the hostels. There are 22 hostels, all named after the mighty rivers of India. Of the hostels, 6 are for female students and 16 are for male students. Hostel Facilities and Community Life

Our hostel facilities feature gardens and libraries for book borrowing. Each hostel provides washing machines, sports facilities, and rooms for music, tech, and television. Common rooms host regular hostel-level meetings. Students celebrate various festivals including Holi, Pongal, Onam, Diwali, and New Year's Eve. Annually, each hostel organizes a vibrant hostel night with food and music, celebrating graduating seniors and fostering community spirit.

Accommodation Type

First-year undergraduate students share rooms, while subsequent years may have single, double, or triple occupancy rooms depending on the hostel. Postgraduate students are allocated sharing or single rooms. Every room includes Internet and LAN access, with additional computer rooms available in the hostels. It is expected that the residents of the hostels shall follow the rules and regulations, violation of which will lead to appropriate disciplinary action. 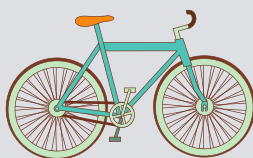

IV. ACADEMICS AND CAREER

Training & Placements

The Indian Institute of Technology Madras is one of the most reputed institutes for technological education and research in India. Known for its strong relations with the industry, the Institute has always been a favorite destination of recruitment for many firms.

The Placement and Internship Office is the nodal point of contact for companies seeking to establish a fruitful relationship with IIT Madras. As our logo says, "Siddhirbhavati Karmaja" - Success comes through hard work. The office interacts with over 800 industries in the country, of which nearly 300 companies visit the campus for holding campus interviews. The institute provides internship placements for students - who wish to intern in an Indian Industrial core company for a minimum of 6 weeks, over the summer following third year - to give students an exposure to the application of technology in the industry and hands-on work experience. This internship is included in the curriculum and carries credits. Many well known companies visit our campus.



Faculty Advisor

The faculty advisor, contrary to popular belief, plays more than just a nominal role. As suggested by the name itself, the position of the faculty advisor has been established in order for students to be guided in planning their course of study and receiving general advice on the academic programme. Moreover, the extent to which the faculty advisor carries out his/her duties is dependent on the students he/she has been assigned to, for if students do not approach him/her with queries, clarifications and problems, his/her ability to advise the students on such matters is reduced.

V.CAMPUS LIFE

Major Landmarks

IIT Madras (IITM) campus is known for several prominent landmarks that reflect its rich history, architectural significance, and academic prowess. Here are some notable landmarks of IIT Madras:

Administration Block: It is close to the Gajendra Circle (GC). Academic Section, Academic Research Section, Administration Section, Accounts Section, Engineering Unit offices, Security Section, Heritage Section are located in this block.

Ajanta: A 24/7 Reading Hall is located at Central Library

Bose-Einstein Guest House (BEGH): It provides lodging facilities for VIPs and Institute Guest.

Career Pathway Centre: It empowers students to navigate and decide their career paths independently. It has been designed to provide students with knowledge, essential skills, and exposure to an entrepreneurial environment, all located in one facility. The key functions of the newly established Career pathway Centre include:

- Career Development Cell – Research: Professionally equip students with skill development
- Entrepreneurship Cell: Hone the entrepreneurship efforts of potential students' fraternity
- Placement and Internship (P&I) Office: Facilitating hiring of students by recruiters for placement and internships.





Central Electronic Centre (CEC): Electronic laboratories are situated at CEC. CEC is located at Electrical Sciences Block.

Central Lecture Theatre (CLT): This air-conditioned Lecture Theatre is located a little ahead of the Central Library, in the Humanities and Social Sciences block. It is often used as the venue for quizzes, special lectures, cultural activities and more.

Central Library: This five storeyed building is home to a large number of books and journals and it's located close to the Gajendra circle. It also has a book bank where one can borrow text-books for a semester.

Central Skill Training and Fabrication Facility (CSTF): Workshop practice laboratories are conducted at CSTF. CSTF is located on Alumni Avenue, opposite to the Mechanical Sciences Block.

Class Room complex (CRC): On Alumni Avenue, it is situated hall-way between the administrative building and the Velachery Gate. The majority of first-year classes are held here.

Discovery Campus: Discovery campus at Thaiyur (163 acre) is located at 36km from the main Campus. It will host state-of-the-art research centres with large dedicated facilities.

Ellora: Hangout place located next to the building of the Department of Management Studies (DoMS).

Engineering Unit: Engineering Unit provides Civil/Electrical maintenance services in Academic, Hostel and Residence zones. For any Civil/Electrical issues, contact the Engineering Unit via your hostel office.

Food for Thoughts (FFT): This is the Food court facility on the first floor of Campus Cafe.

Gajendra Circle (GC): This is the primary intersection and the key reference point for moving around campus.

Heritage Centre: It is located on the front side of the Administration Block-Ground Floor.

Himalaya, Nilgiri, Vindhya Dining Facility: This is a dining hall adjacent to Gurunath, containing majority of the messes.

IC&SR Building: This is located opposite to the Humanities and Social Sciences building on Alumni Avenue. The auditorium here has hosted distinguished lectures by eminent personalities including Dr. Kiran Bedi and Mr. Kamal Hasaan, to mention a few.

IIT Madras Research Park (IITMRP): IITMRP provides an ecosystem for Academic-Industry collaborations with particular focus on R&D and start-up facilities. IITMRP is connected to the IITM campus via bridge.

Institute Hospital: Hospital which provides primary health care services. Hospital is located on first cross road.

New Academic Complex-I (NAC-I): New Academic Complex-I is located next to campus cafe.

New Academic Complex-II (NAC -II): New Academic Complex-II is located adjacent to the building of the Department of Ocean Engineering and opposite to the building of Biotechnology-II.

Office of the Dean of Students (DoST): It is situated adjacent to the west end of the Administration Building.

Office of Hostel Management (OHM): Takes care of various Hostel accommodation/dining related activities.

Open Air Theatre (OAT): It is an amphitheatre where the Film Club shows movies every Saturday. It is situated between the GC and the hostel area. It hosts professional shows at the time of Saarang.

Quark: Student activities space near Saraswathi hostel. A restaurant is located in the ground floor. 81 lounge for student's activities is located on the 1st floor.

Raman and Ramanujan Blocks: This place located These are the places where most of your common classes will take place. These are the places you would want to memorise in and out as this is where you would be headed to, most mornings, half- awake. The ground floor of the Class Room Complex is air-conditioned and is open for the use of students during the quiz weeks to serve as hangout spots for the muggu junta apart from the library.



Security Section: The main office of Security section is located on the back side of the Administration Block-Ground Floor.

Stadium (Manohar C Watsa Stadium): This large open air stadium is situated on Delhi Avenue and is used for various sports activities, air shows during Shastra, and more.

Students' Activity Centre (SAC): The registration will be conducted in this building. It has a music room, a large auditorium, and more. Important events like Institute Day and Convocation are held here.

Taramani Guest House (TGH): Provides lodging and boarding facilities for guest & Faculty/staff/students.

Up-Top Interaction Lounge (UTIL): UTIL is located on the roof-top of the DoST Building. The space is well utilized for the interaction meetings.

Wellness Centre: Institute has Wellness Centre where students can consult mental health professionals. It is situated in the premises if the DoST building (1st floor).



Student Activities

At IIT Madras, student activities are diverse and vibrant, catering to a wide range of interests and fostering a holistic development environment. Here are some key student activities at IIT Madras:

Extra Mural Lectures

As children, we admire; as adolescents, we aspire; as adults, we perspire; and as responsible, successful citizens, we inspire. It is this inspiration that one gets in these Extra Mural Lectures (EML). One cannot achieve big without listening to people who have done it before. It is as they say: "We shall not live long enough to learn from our own mistakes. We have to learn from others' too".

The EMLs cover diverse topics and bring in recognised pioneers and industry experts from across the globe. The EML student team strives to bring the likes of bureaucrats, ground-level heroes, celebrities, political leaders and sports personnel for engaging sessions with the IIT Madras community.



Club & Literary Activities

The cultural sphere in IITM is vibrant with a multitude of student clubs, regional groups, Inter-hostel competitions and other events, as well as the Institute's cultural grand fest Saarang.

Leisure Time Activity Program

The Leisure Time Activity Program (L-TAP) aims to enrich students personalities by giving opportunities to learn various skills in their leisure time. L-TAP courses are designed for beginners and require no prior knowledge in the corresponding subject. It is also an opportunity for students and scholars to discover new interests and hobbies.

Classes take place outside the academic hours. Courses, ranging from film making, terracotta crafts, self-defense techniques like Krav Maga, meditation, western and classical music, Bharatanatyam, spoken Tamil, web programming, swimming, and instruments, are meant to provide a detailed introduction so students can choose what interests them and pursue it further.

Sports

Excellent facilities, including an Olympic-standard swimming pool, a well-equipped gymnasium, the impressive IIT-Chemplast cricket ground, a vast stadium, and a high-tech wood-floored multipurpose indoor stadium, are available in the Students Activity Center.

The Institute has excellent sporting facilities in the campus which include:

- An athletics stadium
- Four tennis courts (synthetic-floored) and badminton courts (wood-floored)
- An Olympic-standard swimming pool
- Hockey & football fields with floodlights

- Two world-class squash courts
- Weightlifting Arena
- Table tennis facility
- A skating rink around Sangam ground

Sport Events

In September, IIT Madras hosts the Sports Fest, an intercollegiate meet for local colleges featuring tennis, volleyball, basketball, hockey, football, table tennis, weightlifting, and badminton. The Institute also hosts two major All India Inter Collegiate Tournaments: the GF&KR All India Invitational Basketball Tournament and the Jimmy George Tournament for Volleyball. The Sanmar Tournament for Cricket is another prestigious event.

Student activities at IIT Madras are diverse and vibrant, fostering holistic development. Key events include the Dean's Trophy in the even semester, featuring six-a-side football, bridge, chess, and cycling, among others. Departments also host their own sporting events at Sangam under floodlights. The Gymkhana Day marks the culmination of all sports activities for the academic year, with winning hostels celebrating their victories.

Inter IIT Sports

The Inter IIT Sports Meet is the annual sports tournament of the IITs. With over 3000 athletes participating from all 23 IITs, the event is the biggest and the oldest pan-IIT event. The Meet encompasses two colossal events:

- Aquatics Meet in October
- Main Meet in December

The General Championship (GC) is awarded for the best performance across events, rotating among the seven old IITs. This fierce competition fosters sportsmanship and cherished memories. IIT Madras has excelled, winning the GC 11 times in a row and securing over 19 wins in 51 Inter-IIT Sports Meets, showcasing the brilliance of its students.

Institute Festivals

Shaastra

Shaastra, the annual technical festival of IIT Madras, celebrates science and engineering since 2000. Organized entirely by students, it spans four days and nights in January, drawing participants from students to professionals. Shaastra was the first student-managed event to implement a Quality Management System, earning ISO certifications for excellence.

The festival features a variety of events, from intense competitions like RoboWars and Hackathons to engaging shows like drone wars and laser displays. Envisage, a techno-entertainment show, highlights unique acts by IIT Madras students.

Shaastra also offers workshops, lectures, and the Research Expo, showcasing groundbreaking research. The Summit addresses societal challenges with innovative solutions, while Shaastra Solutions connects academia with industry to solve real-world problems. This blend of competitions, exhibitions, and educational sessions makes Shaastra a highlight on the global technical festival calendar.



Saarang

Saarang, formerly known as Mardi Gras, has been a cultural cornerstone of IIT Madras for over 45 years. Held annually in January, it is one of India's largest cultural festivals, attracting over 50,000 attendees nationwide.

Explore Chennai

Chennai, formerly known as Madras, is the capital city of the Indian state of Tamil Nadu. It is located on the Coromandel Coast of the Bay of Bengal and is one of the largest cultural, economic, and educational centers in South India. Here are some key aspects and attractions of Chennai:



The Marina Beach

Marina Beach, or simply the Marina, is a natural urban beach in Chennai, Tamil Nadu, India, along the Bay of Bengal. The beach runs from near Fort St. George in the north to Foreshore Estate in the south, a distance of 6.0 km (3.7 mi), making it the second longest urban beach in the world, after Cox's Bazar Beach. It is a prominent landmark in Chennai. The Marina is a primarily sandy beach, with an average width of 300 m (980 ft) and the width at the widest stretch is 437 m (1,434 ft).



Bathing and swimming at the Marina are legally prohibited because of the dangers, as the undercurrent is very turbulent. It is one of the most crowded beaches in the country and attracts about 30,000 visitors a day during weekdays and 50,000 visitors a day during the weekends and on holidays. During summer months, about 15,000 to 20,000 people visit the beach daily.

Mahabalipuram



Mahabalipuram was one of two major port cities during the Pallava kingdom. The town was named after Pallava king Narasimhavarman I, also known as Mamalla. Along with economic prosperity, it became the site of a group of royal monuments, many carved out of the living rock. These are dated to the 7th and 8th centuries: rathas (temples in the form of chariots), mandapas (cave sanctuaries), the giant open-air rock relief, the Descent of the Ganges, and the Shore Temple dedicated to Shiva.

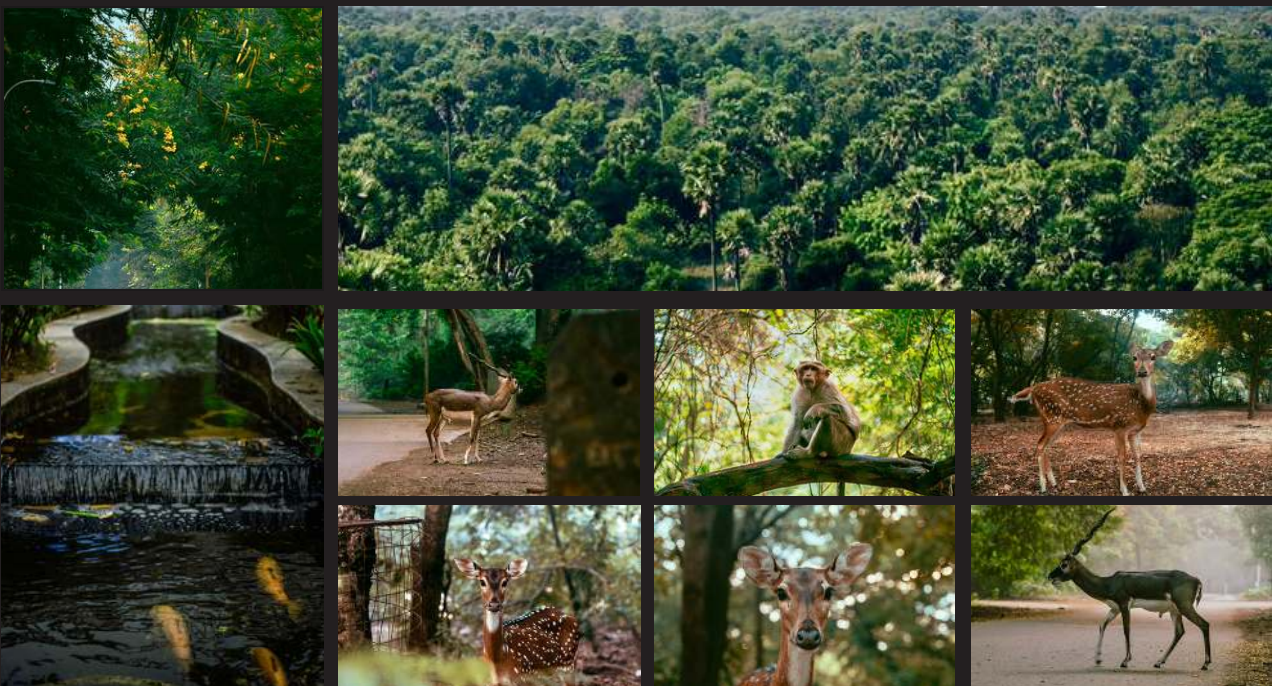
