



Eligibility for Semester Exchange at EBS Law School

Prospective exchange students to EBS Law School are required to:

- ✓ For Law Term: have completed at least one year on a full-time undergraduate law programme or at least one year at a graduate law school by the time the exchange programme begins
- ✓ be fluent in English (the language requirement is waived for native speakers and students whose degree programme is taught 100% in English).





Eligibility for Semester Exchange at EBS Business School

Prospective exchange students to EBS Business School are required to:

- ✓ be officially registered students at one of our partner universities
- ✓ be officially nominated by the home university
- ✓ be in good academic standing
- ✓ be fluent in English (the language requirement is waived for native speakers and students whose degree programme is taught 100% in English).



Application Process in 3 steps



Step 1: Nomination (for partners) Deadline: 15 April 2026

The home university nominates students via an online nomination system (details will be provided in due course).

Step 2: Registration (for students)

Nominated students will receive application details and login information by email within 5 working days.

Step 3: Application (for students) Deadline: 01 May 2026

Students upload the following supporting documents into the application system:

- ✓ 1. Current CV or resumé
- ✓ 2. A copy of all university grade transcripts
- ✓ 3. Document "Regulations for Exchange Students at EBS" (available in the download section of the application system, to be signed)
- ✓ 4. Valid passport/ ID (for no-EU students: photo and data page, must be valid for the entire stay in Germany!)

- ✓ Accommodation: € 400 - € 800 per month
- ✓ Food: € 250 - 300 per month
- ✓ Books and classroom materials: € 50
- ✓ Transportation: semester ticket for public transport in the area; € 164,57 per semester; mandatory for every student of EBS
- ✓ Excursions (not mandatory): approx. € 80
- ✓ Health Insurance (Non-EU): approx. € 130 per month
