Polytech Lille is a graduate school of engineering of the University of Lille. Our school offers 8 degree courses in engineering taught in French, organized in three academic years after two years of undergraduate studies, as well as 1 specific program entirely taught in English. The French "Diplôme d'Ingénieur" is recognized as the equivalent of a Master of Science in Engineering in other countries. As a non-degree exchange student, you will study under the same conditions as regular students. You may apply for admission to our engineering degree courses according to the fields defined in the exchange agreement.

## Name and address of the school

- **Autumn semester:** Beginning of September - Mid January (examination period included)
- **Spring semester :** Mid-January - End of June (examination period included)
- **Examination Period:** continuous assessment (generally end-of-module assessment, course related projects, practical works).  
Industrial internships are also evaluated (written report and oral defense).

The academic calendar for 2026-2027 will be available just before the summer and will be sent to exchange students before their arrival.

## Deadlines for nomination

- **1st May for the Autumn semester or full academic year** (beginning of September – Mid January)
- **15th October for the Spring semester** (Mid January-end of June)

Nominations are required to be sent before deadlines by the home university to: [erasmus@polytech-lille.fr](mailto:erasmus@polytech-lille.fr) (for Erasmus students) or [international@polytech-lille.fr](mailto:international@polytech-lille.fr) (for students outside Europe).

## Deadlines for application

- **10th May for the Autumn semester or full academic year** (beginning of September - Mid January)
- **1st November for the Spring semester** (Mid January-end of June)

## Application for study period

- We recommend that students who intend to come for a study period of one semester apply for the Autumn semester. An important part of the spring semester is dedicated to the industrial internships or to projects in laboratories (particularly during the fourth and fifth year).
- Students who come for the full academic year will combine study period with placements in research laboratories or in industry.
- Nominated students have to fill in [this on-line application form](#) of the University of Lille.
- The application is subject to an academic assessment. Once the application has been officially accepted, a letter of acceptance is issued. The letter of acceptance is suitable for visa request in the home country, when necessary.

## Credits requirements

- **Regular workload :** 30ECTS credits per semester
- **Minimum expected workload for exchange students :** 20ECTS credits per semester

## Official transcript of records

A transcript of records will be issued after the end of the assessment period and after the examiners' school board meeting (mid or end of February for the autumn semester and mid-July for the spring semester). It should normally not exceed five weeks after the end of the mobility.

## Course Catalog

The fourth and fifth year of studies at Polytech Lille are the equivalent of the first and second year of a master's degree. Exchange students may choose from one of the 8 degree courses in engineering and select the modules of one semester (from semester 5 to 10) offered by our school. Exchange students can also choose to enroll in the INSPIRE program (more details below).

Then, they will have to fill in the online learning agreement (only for one semester even for students applying for the full academic year. A second learning agreement will be signed just before the spring semester).

The courses are mainly taught in French, except for the "INSPIRE" program, which is conducted in English. From the web page [www.polytech-lille.fr/english/exchange](http://www.polytech-lille.fr/english/exchange) select one degree course in the "Education" section, and then click on "program" to find the list of modules for each of the eight engineering degree courses.

**Please note that it is not possible to choose courses from different semesters or engineering degree programs due to timetable constraints.**

### Program taught in English:

- [INSPIRE](#) : **IN**ternational semester of **S**ustainable **P**ractices, **I**nnovation, **R**esilience and **E**nergy.  
*Master's level, autumn semester only.*

### Degree courses not open to exchange students:

- Production Engineering: only for students in continuing education and apprenticeship.
- Geomatics and Urban Engineering: only for students in continuing education and apprenticeship.

### Language proficiency

- The language of instruction is French for the degree courses. **The minimum required level of French proficiency for exchange students is B1**, except for the ones enrolled in the INSPIRE program. We do not require an official French language certificate; an informal assessment from a French professor is sufficient.

- The minimum required level of English proficiency is B1 for students coming for a project supervised in English, or for the INSPIRE program.

### French classes

- French classes are offered to exchange students free of charge as part of the curriculum (20 hours each semester) but not for beginner learners.
- Exchange students also have the possibility to attend a fee-paying French summer intensive course. Information available [here](#).

## Visa

- European Union nationals only need a valid ID card or passport to live in France.
- Non-European nationals must issue a visa request with the French embassy in their home country and have a passport that is valid for the entire duration of their stay. Processing times can be long.

After their arrival, all international students are required to secure a residency permit, with the exception of European Union nationals. This is a dematerialised procedure called [ANEF procedure](#).

## Accommodation

If the students want to ask for a room in a university hall of residence, they have to request it in the dedicated section of the application form. Availabilities are limited. Please find below the different types of halls of residence at the University of Lille :

- The cheapest rooms are called "CROUS residences". The monthly rent ranges from 200€ to 400€ per month. A deposit payment of up to one month-rent is required.
- The [Residence Reeflex](#) offers the best facilities for international students but the number of rooms available is limited. It is necessary to indicate "400€" on the "budget monthly rent" section of the exchange student online application form.

The University of Lille will not be able to provide housing for all international exchange students. Thus, we highly recommend you start looking for accommodation on your own, as it is not easy to find an accommodation in the city center. ## Housing Assistance

International students (from the EU only) are eligible to apply for housing assistance as part of a system set up to deal with the relatively high cost of housing in France. The amount of assistance is based on the rental amount and the student's resources. The benefit is not automatic or provided.

Requests for assistance must be completed on the website of the family assistance fund ([CAF](#): Caisse d'Allocation Familiale) within 3 months of taking possession of your lodging (more information will be available at the reception desk of the residence).

To be eligible, it is compulsory to open a bank account in France, as housing assistance is deposited into the beneficiaries' bank accounts.

## Insurances

**Civil Liability Insurance (mandatory):** Civil liability insurance is required for all registrations in French educational institutions. Student mutual insurers offer cover for damage caused to third parties by the policyholder. It guarantees the repair of damages that may be caused by the student to a third person, material...

Usually, the insurance companies propose a package including all the insurances (civil liability + home insurance + additional health coverage).

**Home Insurance (mandatory):** This insurance protects your accommodation in case of fire, water damage, broken glass... Upon arrival, the residence will probably ask the student for a copy of the home insurance. It's better to subscribe online before arrival.

### **Social Security insurance (mandatory):**

EEA students do not need to enrol for French student health insurance. They must be in possession of their European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) card. This card, provided by the country of origin, gives access to health insurance in France. It must be valid for the entire mobility period.

- [Students from outside the EEA:](#)

Mandatory medical cover = French students' social security. Non EU/EEA students must sign up for the French students' social security scheme, it is free of charge.

### **Additional health insurance cover (Highly recommended):**

It supplements the reimbursement of medical expenses beyond the amount re-funded by the students' social security scheme or through the EHIC (to almost 100 %). We highly recommend you to subscribe an additional health insurance cover (called « Mutuelle » or « Complémentaire santé » in French). Prices vary depending on the extent of the cover. (minimum : around 12 €/month)

### **Repatriation insurance (Highly recommended):**

It is also recommended to take out a repatriation insurance in your home country before arriving in France.

### Accommodation:

Room at the CROUS: €300-450. 20m<sup>2</sup> studio.

Apartment in Lille: €600 or more.

Reeflex room : €470-540.

Room in a private residence: €450 or more.

Housing insurance: €50 per year.

### Food:

Meal at the university restaurant (RU): €3.30.

Dish of the day in a brasserie: €12-17.

Typical weekly shopping basket: between €50 and €75 (including 1 daily meal at the RU).

### Transport:

1 bus/metro journey: €1.80.

Ilévia subscription for 4-25 year olds: €32.45 per month.

Ilévia subscription for general public: €65 per month (discount for CAF beneficiaries). Check the [Ilévia](#) webpage for details.

### Utilities:

Internet €25 per month.

Mobile €10 per month or more.

Electricity €50 per month.

### Leisure activities:

1 cinema ticket at student rate: €9.
