


- In addition to SPARC, VAJRA, etc.
- Exclusive for visiting top ranked universities 2 to 3 months during summer break
 Proposed: Top 25 of QS rankings or researchers with high research credentials
- ✓ High Risk High Reward (per faculty)
- ✓ One visit to start with
- ✓ A PhD student to accompany faculty on their visit
- ✓ Amount per visit will be according to approved budget
- ✓ Support ~5-10 faculty per year
- Find a donor for the program to continue

Proposed Process/ Method



- 1. International research collaborations with IIT Madras
- 2. Objective: Fund "out of the box" ideas with novel concepts which are expected to change the course of research/technology if successful
- 3. Stricter, multiple, and independent selection and assessment yardstick
- ✓ Proposal submission to be reviewed and graded by a top researcher in the field (International)
- ✓ Presentation along with the proposed collaborator to the international committee
- ✓ High returns: High quality peer reviewed publications, product development, patents, JDP, JMP, etc.
- ✓ Past collaborations, joint publications, joint research project, joint guidance, etc. to be considered
- ✓ Encouraging young faculty to also take up top-class collaborations



1. Do you have an active collaboration with your international doctoral/ post-doctoral supervisor?








2. Do you currently have active international collaboration(s), excluding your doctoral/ post-doctoral supervisor/ institute?





3. What is the mode of your current collaboration?






5. Do you think international collaboration is important, necessary, and complementary to your research at IIT Madras?






6. Did you ever approach anyone in one of the top 20 QS universities (if you are not collaborating already) with a collaboration proposal?






7. If the answer to question 6 is no, what do you think were the potential reasons?
