### Your studies

Class sizes are small meaning you will have plenty of interaction with academic staff, who are experts in their field and involved in the latest research. Choose from a range of academic modules across the following subject areas:

Each academic module usually includes a field trip for you to put what you have learned into real-world context. Previous destinations include Castle Howard, Brontë Parsonage Museum, Yorkshire Sculpture Park, National Science and Media Museum and MediaCityUK.

Earn University of Leeds credits which you can transfer to your current degree. Transfer of credits is subject to the approval of your home institution.

### Next steps

To be eligible to apply for our summer school you should be enrolled at a university, or be a recent graduate and meet our requirements:

### **Entry requirements**

#### Minimum academic requirements

- 56 average (UK scale)
- 2.8/4.0 grade point average (or equivalent)

#### Minimum English language requirements

If the country you study in isn't on the Student visa exceptions list (https://www.gov.uk/ student-visa/knowledge-of-english), you'll need to submit evidence that you meet our language requirements. If you're being taught in English at your home university, you don't need to provide a language certificate. Instead, we'll ask you to provide evidence that you are taught in English.

#### Minimum language requirements:

- IELTS 5.5 (5.5 overall with no component lower than 5.0)
- TOEFL (iBT) 80 (80 overall, listening and reading: 18, speaking and writing: 19)
- TOEIC: listening 400, reading 385, speaking 160 and writing 150
- Password Skills 5.5 overall (5.5 overall with no component lower than 5.0)
- Other equivalent language test scores may also be considered
